Branch Pickup

Monday - Friday, April 10-14

The road crew will come by only ONCE during the week so have your branches out on Monday. They will not be collected unless they are properly prepared. If you have questions call Roadmaster, Dave Allen, at 610-388-9180.

This program is for residents to get rid of fallen limbs or small trees. IT IS NOT TO BE USED AS A COMMERCIAL TREE SERVICE OR FOR LOT CLEARING.

The Township mulch pile is available for residents' use. Contact Dave Allen to coordinate pickup or with questions.

Preparation of brush and limbs:

- Brush and limbs must be from your Pennsbury Township property.
- Roots stumps and limbs with wire and/or nails will NOT be picked up.
- All brush and limbs must be in the right of way.
- Dry, dead brush and tree limbs must be tied in bundles 3' long or less. Each bundle should be not greater than 12" in diameter.
- Fresh-cut (green) limbs, 2" in diameter and larger, should be left full length, placed along roadside with large ends closest to the road, not in a random pile.
- Only 8 bundles of brush and/or tree limbs and 10 fresh cut branches are allowed per property.



♦TOWNSHIP AUDIT

The yearly audit has been completed and there are no adverse findings. The audit has been filed with the State. A summary of this report can be found on the next page.

SUMMER ROADWORK

- All roads in Chadds Ford Knoll will be worked on this summer. The work will be done after school lets out.
- All roads that have striping will be painted. The contracting company will put up cones to alert drivers of wet paint. Line painting will be done after road work is complete. This is done on an annual basis.

SMART 911

What if there's a fire,

a medical emergency, or a child goes missing? When you dial 9-1-1 under stress, you may not have access to important details, or you may have trouble remembering them. Smart911 is a new service in Chester County that allows you to create a Safety Profile at: www.smart911.com that includes details you want the 9-1-1 center and public safety response teams to know about your household in an emergency. When you dial 9-1-1, from a phone associated with your Safety Profile, that information automatically displays to the 9-1-1 call taker, allowing them to send responders based on upto-date location and emergency information. With your Safety Profile, responders can arrive aware of many details they would not otherwise know. Fire crews can arrive knowing exactly how many people live in your home and where the bedrooms are located. EMS personnel can know family

members' allergies or specific medical conditions. Police can access a photo of a missing family member in seconds rather than minutes or hours, helping the search start faster.

SPRING TIPS FOR REDUCING STORMWATER RUNOFF

- •Plant a large stature tree. They are great for stormwater control. At maturity they intercept over 1,000 gallons of rainwater each year. Their foliage and bark intercept rainfall, and their canopies also reduce the force of rain hitting the soil, reducing erosion.
- •When you fertilize the lawn, you're not just fertilizing the lawn.

 Excess nitrogen and phosphorus from lawn fertilization is frequently a pollutant to streams by fostering the growth of algae which depletes oxygen levels, so try not to over fertilize.

Planning Commission Update

The following news and activities from the Planning Commission (PC) have taken place since the last edition of the Pennsbury Township News.

- Elected officers for 2017 are: Chair Dennis Smith, Vice-Chair Bob Crandell and Secretary Jeff Streitel.
- Appointed responsibilities are: Lynn Luft Historical Commission Liaison, Corinne Murphy Brandywine Battlefield Task Force Representative and Jim Ware Kennett Area Regional Planning Commission Representative.
- We discussed a plan being proposed by Mark Gosik to open up the existing right of way between two homes located on Independence Way by installing a road. The PC stated that all neighbors on Independence Way should be notified about the plan. The PC took a neutral position and referred the matter to the Board of Supervisors.
- To provide further clarity on impervious ground cover, the PC recommended editing a section of the Zoning Ordinance which addresses the calculation of permitted lots and the open space required.

- We recommended that the Board of Supervisors grant approval of the final plan for Windmill Hollow Subdivision to Richard Sanford subject to stated conditions.
- The PC continued working on a water protection initiative which is being led by Jim Ware.
- In addition to several other related activities across recent meetings, we hosted key representatives from Save Our Water who shared their insight and experiences of an on-going water protection matter in New Garden Township. We anticipate recommending upgrades to our ordinances later this year.

All residents are welcome to attend Planning Commission meetings which are scheduled for the second and fourth Mondays of the month at 5:00 pm and are held at the Township Building.

Shredding Event Saturday, April 29 (9 am- noon)

This is **FREE** for Pennsbury Township residents and will be held in the Township Building parking lot. **No commercial businesses**.

This is an opportunity for you to shred those important documents that should not be sent to the landfill. Identity theft is everywhere so take this opportunity to dispose of sensitive items properly.

Roadside Cleanup

Saturday, April 29

This is a good project for neighborhood groups to clean up the roadside around their homes. It also is a great way for high school students to acquire community service hours.

Vests, gloves and bags will be provided by the Township. Filled trash bags, if left on the roadside, will be picked up by the road crew. Call the Maintenance Garage at 610-388-9180 to leave your location and request supplies.

Township Restrictions on Open Burning

Pennsbury Township Zoning Ordinance 162-1911, sets strict limitations on open burning.

- Open burning of anything other than leaves and small branches is strictly prohibited at all times. There shall be no emission of smoke, ash, dust, fumes, vapors, gases, or other matter toxic or noxious to air which violates the Pennsylvania Air Pollution Control Laws.
- Open burning of leaves and small branches is prohibited during the following intervals:

On weekends and Holidays at any time On weekdays between 4:00 PM and 9:00 AM

- Therefore, open burning of leaves and small branches may only be legally conducted during weekdays from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM at which time the fire shall be fully extinguished.
- Before any legal open burning is conducted, the Longwood Fire Company must be informed in advance and the fire comply with all fire department requirements. It should be noted that approval by Longwood Fire Co is necessary, but not sufficient. The Township regulations must be adhered to regardless of Longwood Fire Co approval.

There have been several instances of illegal open burning in the Township this past year and some have argued that the Longwood Fire Company said it was OK. Their OK is required, but it alone is not permission to burn. Also, Township notices regarding leaf and branch pickup carry the underlying ordinance restriction regarding open burning.

Please be good neighbors and comply with the Township open burning regulations.

Forgot What You Can Recycle?

All Southeastern Chester County Refuse Authority (SECCRA) bins at the Township Building have this information posted on the side. Please note the items which may NOT be recycled. If any are found in a bin, then the entire bin is landfilled! If you care enough to recycle, please do it right.

Electronics Recycling

Please be aware that the PA Covered Device Law prohibits TV's and monitors to be disposed of in a landfill or transfer station. Therefore there is nowhere in Chester County to dispose of these items.

For a \$25 fee Best Buy in Wilmington, DE will take tube TVs smaller than 32", flat panel TVs, LCD, Plasma, LED smaller than 50" and portable TV's.

They offer free TV haul-away with the purchase of a replacement TV and delivery by Best Buy. Stand alone pickup without a qualifying TV purchase is \$99.99.

Chester County Solid Waste Authority in Honeybrook will continue to collect computers and other peripherals at no cost. Southeastern Chester County Refuse Authority (SECCRA) in West Grove will take computers for a \$5.00 fee.

Unionville-Chadds Ford School District News


