Township Spring Cleanup Events

Branch Pickup April 27 - May 1

The crew will come by only **ONCE** during the week so be sure to have your branches out early. If the work is not finished by May 1, it will be continued the next week.

This program is for residents to get rid of fallen limbs or small trees, IT IS NOT TO BE USED AS A COMMERCIAL TREE SERVICE OR FOR LOT CLEARING.

Preparation of brush and limbs (they will not be collected unless they are properly prepared) —

- Brush and limbs must be from your Pennsbury Township property.
- Roots, stumps and limbs with wire and/or nails will NOT be picked up.
 - nails will 4000 3' maximum—
- All brush and limbs must be in the right of way.
- Dry, dead brush and tree limbs must be tied in bundles 3' long or less and no greater than 12" in diameter.
- Fresh-cut (green) limbs, 2" in diameter and larger, should be left full length, placed along roadside with large ends closest to the road, not in a random pile.
- Limit of 8 bundles of brush and/or tree limbs and a limit of 10 fresh cut branches per property.

Light at the End of the Tunnel

The Township's historic resources survey will be completed this summer. Our consultants, Wise Preservation Planning, will present its findings to Township residents at a public meeting that we hope many of you will attend. We think you will be impressed by Pennbury's rich architectural heritage.

The 1980 survey listed 85 historic resources, our 2009 survey will have 175 resources photographed and described and even more mapped. With so many histories to provide the consultant and some resources not sufficiently researched at this time, the Historical Commission has decided to continue its research and include the histories in the official survey document as they are completed. If you have any information on your historic home that you have not shared with us to date, please let us know.

The Planning Commission is seeing light at the end of the tunnel, too, as it completes its work on revising the Township's zoning code. This is of special interest to the Historical Commission because one of the last elements of the code is revision of Pennsbury's Historic Preservation Ordinance. The Planning Commission is currently reviewing the proposed amendment in the context of the entire zoning ordinance. After the Planning Commission has completed its review, the updated zoning code will be presented to residents at a public meeting and then forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for consideration.

Watch for notices of both of these public meetings in th next few months. You'll understand what the Historical Commission and Planning Commission have been laboring over!
